Cambridge *Rosalie*

This is an 8 ½ inch Cambridge water goblet with the Rosalie etch (No.731) on a yellow Aero Optic stem. Cambridge produced Rosalie from the late 1920's into the 1930's on colored and crystal glass. This yellow Aero Optic stem was produced only one year in 1929 which makes it hard to find due to its limited production. The Aero Optic blank, a pattern itself, has a soft hobnail or dimpled surface to it.

[Rosalie](#) is a busy floral pattern of leaves and flowers but with a distinctive square spiral that sets it apart from other etchings.

Although this Rosalie stem is on the Aero Optic blank the dinnerware and accessory pieces are on the Decagon blank.



Pattern detail

Although Cambridge produced Rosalie in variety of its colors, only the pink, green and amber are found in enough pieces to create sets. There are also some pieces of Ebony decorated with the Rosalie etch.



We paid a \$1.00 for it at the flea market in Armada. The person selling it had mostly general household goods and a couple pieces of glass. At the time we had no idea what the pattern was but thought it looked attractive, especially for a dollar.
